The sacred status of kings, leaders, and chieftains. Basic to an understanding of sacred kingship is a recognition that the exercise of power of one person over other persons or over a community (local, regional, or imperial) in early times was general and not divided. Power could be exercised by only one person—one who simultaneously had the necessary physical (individual and corporate) and spiritual (psychic) strength and influence—over both people and objects.

In theory a medieval king was God's representative on Earth, and in some nations kings were literally above the law. In practice, the power of the king was limited by feudal nobles and influential churchmen. A new king had to swear an oath to fulfill the responsibilities of a monarch. The details of this oath varied from one land to another, but included the responsibility to keep the peace, to administer justice and to uphold the law.
