The past participle as an adjective has an passive meaning (I was bored by the movie, I was fascinated by the book). The object of the participle (here: "I" in both sentences) is the result [Ergebnis] or the receiver [Empfänger] of a feeling: I get the feeling of boredom [Langeweile] from the movie.

To form the past participle of a regular verb, you drop the infinitive ending (-ar, -er, -ir) and add -ado to the stem of -ar verbs and -ido to the stem of -er and -ir verbs.This is equivalent to adding -ed to many verbs in English.. A past participle is not a tense, but a verb form which comes in handy in several situations: used as an adjective, used in passive voice constructions, and as part of "perfect tense" conjugations. Some examples: The works painted by Picasso were very popular. The buildings were destroyed by the tornado.
